Committee member Ben Benoit asked about the progress of the Bundy Canyon Road widening project and its need to be viewed as a regional project.

Committee member Kelly Seyarto asked about the Keller Road Interchange project and its importance to the area.

Bob Moehling stated that the City is in the initial planning phase of the project.
