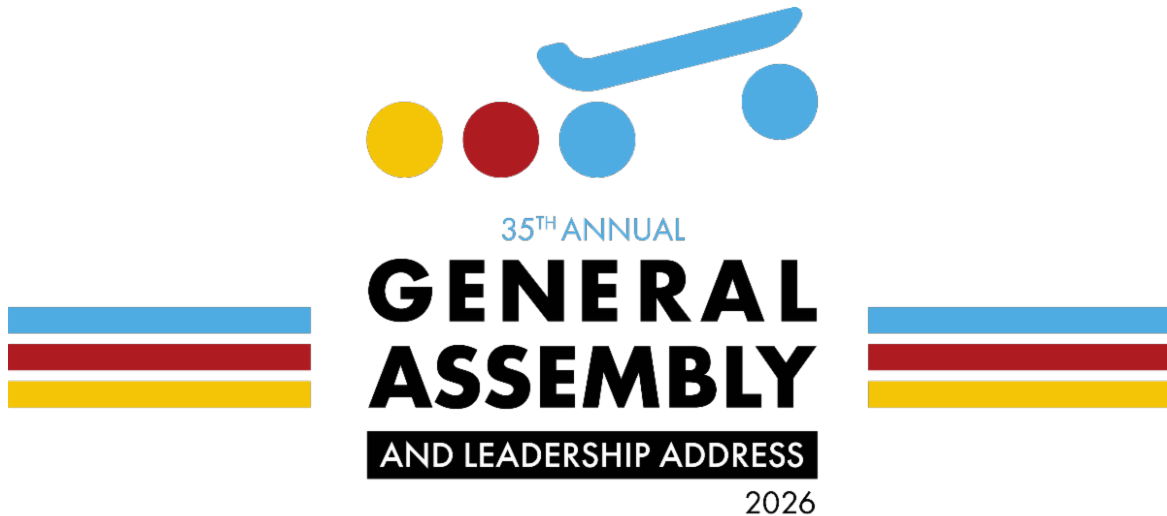

Strengthening Community Resilience through WRCOG's Energy Resilience Plan 2.0

WRCOG is developing the Energy Resilience Plan 2.0 (ERP 2.0) to strengthen infrastructure and help communities across Western Riverside County prepare for and respond to emergencies and power outages. Supported by an Adaptation Planning Grant from the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation, ERP 2.0 explores the feasibility of implementing microgrids at key facilities and establishing Community Resilience Centers (CRCs) within existing buildings. CRCs serve as resources for residents before, during, and after emergencies, while also offering year-round programs that enhance community well-being and resilience to climate hazards and natural disasters.



WRCOG is seeking community input to better understand how natural disasters and climate hazards impact residents and to identify the types of programs and services that

would be most valuable at proposed CRCs. The following cities have expressed interest in evaluating one of their existing facilities for potential use as a Community Resilience Center, and residents are encouraged to participate in a short survey to help inform the study:

Students Explore Local Wildlife at RCHCA Field Trips

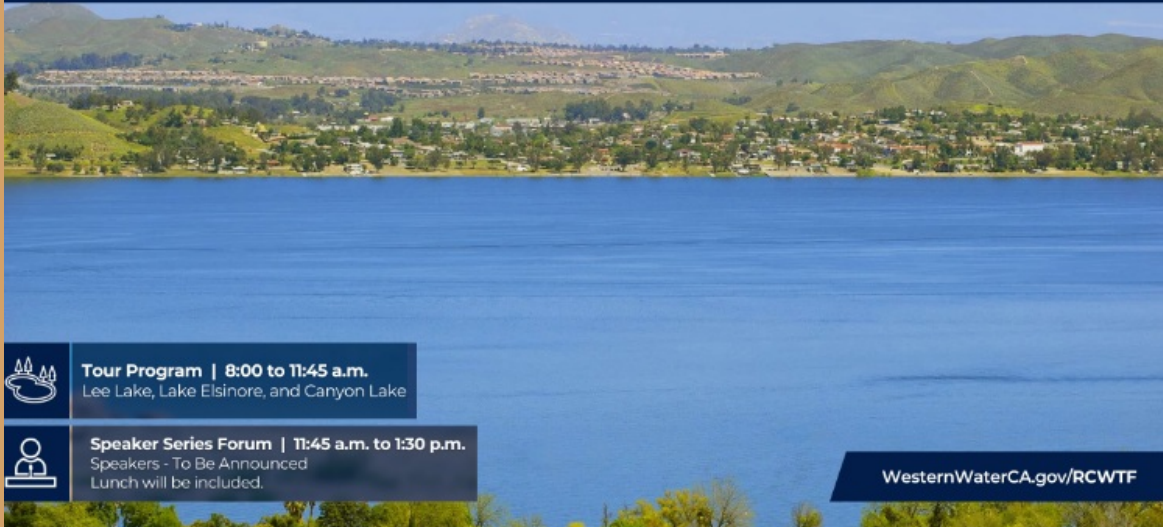


This November, students are participating in Celebrating Endangered Species Day field trips at Lake Mathews and the Southwest Multi-Species Reserve in Winchester, hosted by the Riverside County Habitat Conservation Agency (RCHCA). Over 300 students from three Western Riverside County schools are taking part, enjoying a live animal presentation and interactive science stations where they learn about endangered species, research methods, and the importance of clean water and healthy ecosystems.

The science stations also incorporate guided hikes, giving students a closer look at native plants, animals, and land management practices in action. Hands-on experiences like these connect classroom science to the natural world and show students the real-world impact of protecting local habitats.
