Summary:

Rate adjustments for residential and collection services were primarily driven by CPI-based increases, regulatory requirements such as Senate Bill (SB) 1383, and rising operational and disposal costs, with variations across service types and rate structures. Overall rate changes for residential and commercial services remained within 2% - 7%.

Purpose / WRCOG 2022-2027 Strategic Plan Goal:

The purpose of this item is to present the findings of the Residential and Commercial Rate Survey. This effort aligns with WRCOG's 2022-2027 Strategic Plan Goal #6.3 (Continuing to support the Solid Waste & Recycling Program).

Discussion:

Background

Each year, WRCOG conducts an informational waste rate survey of surrounding member agencies regarding fees and programs from local waste haulers. The survey comprises the residential and commercial waste fees for refuse, recycling, and organics recycling within Riverside County. Member agencies may use the survey as a resource to compare with neighboring jurisdictions to understand the local rates and additional services provided by waste haulers.

Present Situation

Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Residential and Commercial Rate Survey: Rates for both commercial and residential refuse services have historically been increased by inflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which is incorporated into customer rates. The CPI information used for these adjustments is calculated and applied by the haulers as part of their CPI-related rate adjustment proposals and is based on the calendar year 2024 data published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor

Statistics. For that period, CPI for All Urban Consumers in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario area (Series ID CUURS49CSA0) increased by 2.61%. Under certain franchise agreements with their hauler, some member agencies have annual rate adjustments capped at 4%. Some member agencies have experienced extraordinary increases or adjustments that are not reflected in the CPI. These adjustments may be associated with regulatory requirements and programs (i.e., SB 1383 compliance fee) or shifts in market conditions, such as rising industry costs and increases in landfill tipping fees. The County of Riverside's Waste Management Department adjusted its disposal rate by 2.88% for Fiscal Year 2025/2026 to account for sustained increases in labor expenses, capital improvement costs, regulatory compliance costs, and site maintenance.

Some member agencies have structured their rate schedules to separate organic waste services into food waste and non-food (green) waste categories. Additionally, some agencies offer bundled commercial compliance rate structures that include refuse, recycling, and organics recycling services under a single rate.

Some member agencies have elected to pass through SB 1383 procurement obligations to their contracted waste haulers, resulting in additional rate adjustments that primarily affect commercial and roll-off customers. Under this approach, the contracted hauler is responsible for managing procurement requirements, including providing unlimited compost at no cost to the city and its residents. Any excess compost not utilized locally is distributed by the hauler through other channels.

Overall, residential rate adjustments range from 1% to 6.5%. For commercial services, rate adjustments for refuse collection (3-cubic-yard container, once per week) range from 2% to 7%, while recycling service adjustments for the same service level range from 2% to 7%. For member agencies with mixed organics programs utilizing a 65-gallon organics cart, rate adjustments range from 2% to 6%. For agencies with separate green waste and food waste collection programs, each utilizing a 65-gallon organics cart, rate adjustments also range from 2% to 6%. Bundled commercial rate structures generally experienced adjustments ranging from 3% to 4%.






Single-family - 96 Gallon Refuse Cart




Commercial Refuse - 3 Cubic-Yard Bin Once a Week
